Toolie enters schoolyard, pulling his tool wagon with a boy riding on top. Baba is working in the schoolyard and greets Toolie as he approaches.)

BABA

Good morning, Toolie! Who's your little friend?

TOOLIE

This young fellow wants to go to school.

BABA

(excitedly)

A student?! Oh Toolie! You don't know how important this is! Poor Guru's been making posters and knocking on doors every day for months looking for students. He's desperate for this good news!

TOOLIE

Desperate? (turns to Ace) Then I guess we better go in and cheer him up a little!

(Toolie pulls the wagon over to the schoolhouse door, motions to Ace to stay put, then knocks and opens the door.) Anybody home?

GURU

Uncle Toolie! What brings you to Garden School?

TOOLIE

Young Guru! Just bringing the mail from the Commissioner's office. By the way, I found one addressed to you. It's from Canada! (Toolie hands Guru the envelope)

GURU

(puzzled)

Canada? Must be from that ad I put in Canadian Pen-Pal magazine.

(now with comical bravura)

But it's probably just another fan from some far corner of the world. I just can't keep 'em away, Uncle Toolie! I just can't keep 'em away!

TOOLIE

(chuckles a little)

Well, I best be moving on – don't want yesterday to pass me by. Enjoy your fan mail, young Guru. Oh, by the way, I meant to ask how the new school's coming along.

GURU

Couldn't be better, Uncle Toolie! No students yet, but I kind of like it that way. It saves on supplies.

TOOLIE

(chuckles)

Yes, I guess it would. Oh, by the way, I have a young fellow out in the wagon who wants to be your student. But I guess you wouldn't be much interested.

GURU

(suddenly serious)

A student?

TOOLIE

I'll leave him here just in case you change your mind. And if things go okay, the Commissioner says he has several more for you. They all failed their Middle School entrance exams. He wants you to keep them occupied and out of trouble.

(Toolie motions for the boy to come inside; the cheerful boy hops down from the wagon and skips into the schoolhouse. Toolie closes the door behind him and exits.)

GURU

Hi! I'm your teacher! My name's Guru – what's yours?

ACE

(fascinated with Guru's wheelchair)

I'm Ace. Can I ride on this?

GURU

(with a chuckle)

Maybe later, Ace. I kind of need it now.

ACE

Why do you need it?

GURU

Well, I need it to get around. I have a problem walking.

ACE

Why do you have a problem walking?

GURU

Because when I was in First Grade I had an accident.

ACE

How'd you have an accident?

GURU

Oh, it's a long story, Ace. I'll tell you about it someday when we have more time. Do you live here in Ko-Lat Village?

ACE

No, I live on the other side of Jeeno – in the refugee camp.

GURU

Oh my, that's a long way to come every day!

ACE

But I'm fast. Watch.

(Ace runs back and forth down the center aisle)

See? I'm very fast. Someday I'm going to run in the Olympics.

GURU

(laughing)

Wow! You are very fast, Ace! Did your parents teach you to run so fast?

ACE

GURU
