# Segment 18: Language Heroes

(The stage is split in half. On one side Baba is teaching Enemian to the Candle High students. On the other side, thousands of miles away, Twimfina is teaching English to the Garden School students. Both sides mirror each other, reciting the same words at the same time.)

#### Instructions:

 $B \notin T = Baba and Twimfina / Stu = Students / 1Stu = One Student from Each Class / Metronome speed is about 60 bpm / the underlined syllables fall on the beat (but aren't necessarily accented) / the words are not sung, but are spoken with expression (which gives them a natural musicality) / there is an optional piano accompaniment;$

- B&T: *(chuckling)* <u>That's</u> the problem <u>when</u> you know just <u>Lang</u>uage Number <u>One</u> You <u>miss</u> the chance to <u>know</u> the world and <u>miss</u> a lot of <u>fun</u>

[two students raise hands during previous verse; both B&T point to the students on the word "fun" so that the acknowledged students can respond immediately]

5.

- 1Stu: <u>What</u> if someone <u>laughs</u> at us or <u>tries</u> to pick a <u>fight</u> <u>If</u> we do not <u>know</u> a word or <u>don't</u> pronounce it <u>right</u>?
- B&T: Just ignore the <u>laugh</u>ter and the <u>in</u>sults that are <u>hurled</u>. <u>Things</u> like that can <u>ne</u>ver hurt the <u>her</u>oes of the <u>world</u>.

[two students raise hands during previous verse; both B&T point to the students on the word "world" so that the acknowledged students can respond immediately]

6.

- 1Stu: The <u>world</u> has many <u>lang</u>uages and <u>all</u> of them are <u>great</u> <u>Why</u> pick this, the <u>lang</u>uage of a <u>people</u> that we <u>hate</u>?
- B&T: <u>That</u> is why we're <u>learning</u> it we're <u>knocking</u> down the <u>wall</u> Com<u>mu</u>nication <u>really</u> is the <u>answer</u> to it <u>all</u>.

7.

B&T: You will find that when you learn this Language Number Two You will have so many friends, you won't know what to do. (pointing to other side) Far away a class like this is also filled with stars. As we learn to speak their language, they are learning ours.

[two students raise hands during previous verse; both B&T point to the students on the word "ours" so that the acknowledged students can respond immediately]

8.

- 1Stu: If <u>stu</u>dents over <u>there</u> are learning <u>Lang</u>uage Number <u>Two</u> <u>We</u> can just re<u>lax</u> and look for <u>some</u>thing else to <u>do</u>! [2-beat pause for laughter]
- B&T: *(pointing to other side)* What if there's a joker over there who says the same? *[2-beat pause for laughter]* That is why it's only fair we all share in the pain

9.

B&T: When we learn their language, it would <u>really</u> be a <u>treat</u> If <u>some</u>how we could <u>find</u> a way that <u>all</u> of us could <u>meet</u>. *[2-beat pause for excited response]* If we were to <u>travel</u> there, the <u>first</u> thing we should <u>do</u> Is <u>smile</u> and shake their <u>hands</u> and sing out:

[the tempo slows down here to about 48 bpm to match the tempo of the upcoming song]

B&T: (sung on the pitch C#5) <u>PEACE</u> TO <u>YOU</u> FROM <u>LANG</u>UAGE NUMBER <u>TWO</u> Stu: (sung on the pitch C#5) <u>PEACE</u> TO <u>YOU</u> FROM <u>LANG</u>UAGE NUMBER <u>TWO</u> (singing) THOSE WHO KNOW JUST LANGUAGE NUMBER ONE MISS A CHANCE TO HAVE A LOT OF FUN MISS A CHANCE TO MAKE A LOT OF FRIENDS CHANCE TO GO WHERE THEY HAVE NEVER BEEN NOT THE GREATEST SITUATION STUCK AT HOME WITH LANGUAGE NUMBER ONE
